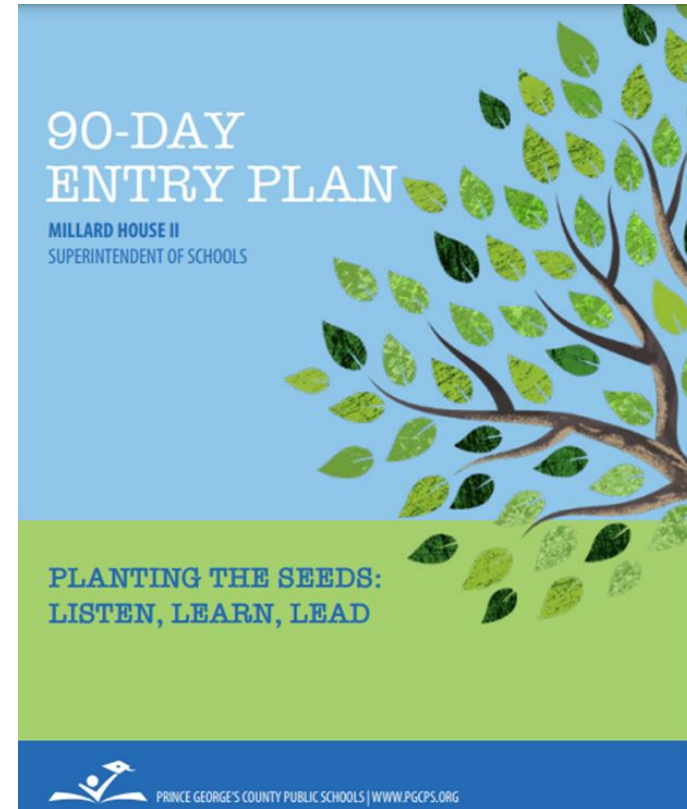

# Special Education Organization Chart

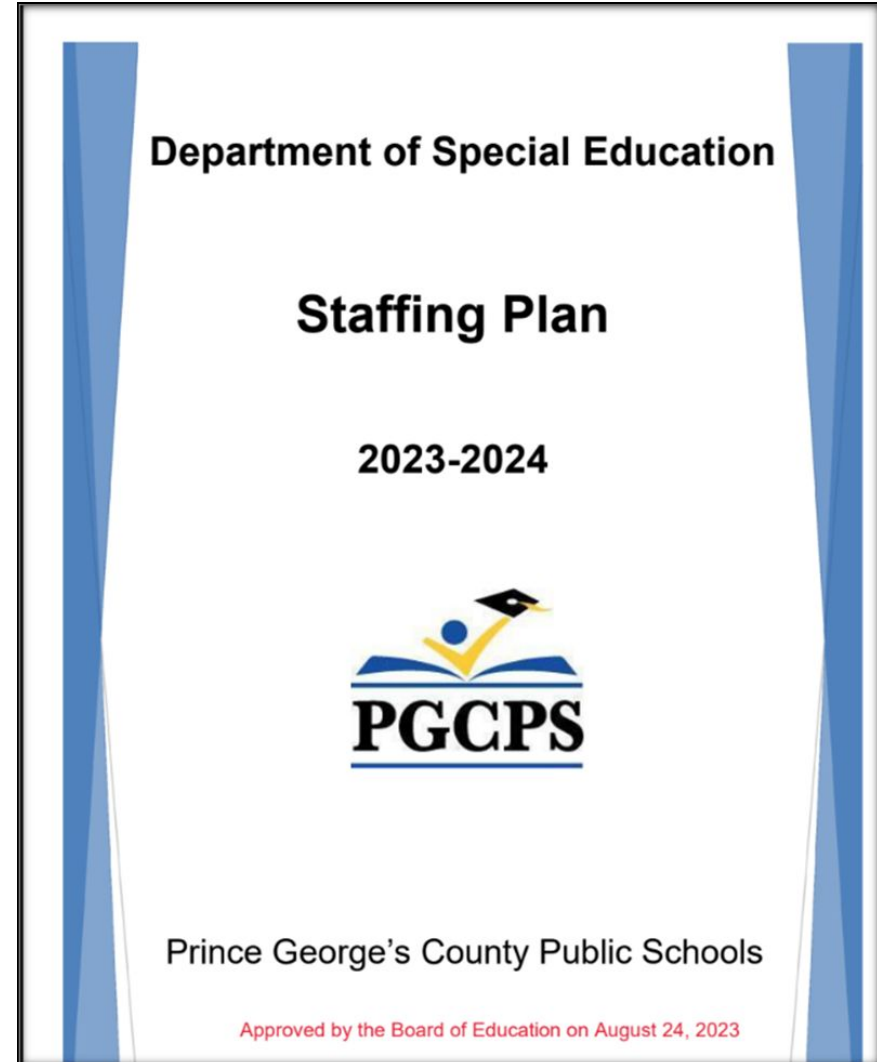

# School Year 2023-2024 Department of Special Education Strategic Focuses



Implement a tiered systems of support framework for targeted PGCPs schools based on established data metrics that provides a school with customized differentiated support that varies in intensity and frequency.



Rethink how PGCPs provides services to students with disabilities with a keen focus on students with autism, social-emotional, behavioral, and specific learning disabilities by leveraging community partners to maximize staffing resources and strengthen service delivery models.



Train teachers on the use of evidence-based strategies for students with disabilities that are incorporated into the district mathematics curriculum frameworks to ensure access to the general education curriculum with a professional learning and coaching plan.



Pilot the use of the monitoring system at selected schools to evaluate the quality of service delivery models and programs for autism, social-emotional, and specific learning disabilities.
